Part 5: Complacency

"So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."

Revelation 3:16

It's easy to complain about having to work. Maybe we do not like our boss or our coworkers. Perhaps we do not like our jobs at all. Jobs require effort. Effort implies work. A few days ago, I was working an auction as I do most every Saturday. At the end of the auction, one of the buyers came to me and said, "Y'all work really hard here. You must be exhausted." It's true, I was very tired. But I smiled and replied, "We might as well work hard now because one day we won't have the chance to work anymore." As Brad Paisley's new song says, "There is a last time for everything."

Working provides numerous rewards. For example, work provides us with monetary income (which I think we all can appreciate). Also, working establishes moral character that slothfulness neglects. Laziness is dangerous and will sink our fellowship.

Jesus tells John what to communicate to the church at Laodicea in Revelation 3. The church's problem was that they had allowed themselves to become complacent. They were not living in sin, but neither were they on fire for God. They went to church, sang the songs, and yet that wasn't enough to please Jesus. Jesus told them through John that he would spit them out of his mouth. Jesus was literally conveying that their complacency made him physically sick to the point of removing the church from his body. It is just as bad to be complacent as it is to be living in sin.

We often find ourselves in the same situation. We believe in God, we claim to love God, but like the church at Ephesus, we have lost our first love. Like the church at Laodicea, we are lukewarm. Work is uncomfortable. Work is tiring. But we should work now because one day we are promised rest. Let's all continue to work for the Lord and never become complacent.

UNCONDITIONAL LOVE

Have you ever considered God's unconditional love? To understand what unconditional love is, let's first look at what conditional means. The Oxford Dictionary defines conditional as subject to one or more conditions or requirements being met. All too often we act with conditional love. I ran across a contemporary definition that I think sums it up nicely. Conditional love: love as long as you add value to my life and please me. One prime example of this is our high divorce rate of 40%-50% (sources vary on actual numbers) with spouses often being considered a disposable commodity.

What about unconditional love? By definition, unconditional love has no limits or reservations. John 3:16 shows this clearly, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." God sent Jesus to bring the gift of eternal salvation to the whole world. No one is excluded by God. Any exclusion is made by the individual person using the free will God also gave mankind to not fulfill the requirements. Pair this with Psalm 136:2, "Give thanks to God of gods, for His lovingkindness is everlasting." These scriptures give us a glimpse of a God who loves us unconditionally with a love that never fails, endures forever, and is uncalculating and not motivated by any personal gain. God's love provides the faithful Christian with cleansing and freedom from sin, as well as wholeness of spirit.

God sets a high standard for those who profess to be Christians to strive for. 1John 3:18, "Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth." Jesus said that we are to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mark 12:31). It means that we are to love the sinner and do what we can to redeem them from their sin. Remember, we love them and not whatever sin(s) they are caught up in. John makes this very clear in 1 John 4:8, "The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love."

God's unconditional love is pure and wonderful, setting a lofty standard for us to strive to meet. One known to the world and recognized for putting the poor and helpless above herself was the catholic nun, Mother Teresa. She is credited with saying the following, "Intense love does not measure, it just gives." How does your love measure on God's scale of giving?
