I was speaking with a couple who visited our services when I heard some very encouraging words. "We want to find a church where we can be workers." Lessons from Barbed Wire Pt. 3: Overcoming Obstacles

"Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing."

James 1:2-4

The area we are fencing on the Houston farm is basically all brush, trees, and thorns. Any other farming operation would likely have brought in a bulldozer and pushed down the old fence along with all the trees that were in the way and put in a new, clean fence. However, that cost a ton of money and we did not want to lose the shade trees for the cattle. Thus, we did the only feasible thing we knew to do. We became lumberjacks.

My brother and I went out with two STIHL chainsaws and began to cut a path just wide enough for us to walk through with a roll of barbed wire and other fencing supplies. Once the path was cut, we should be able to stretch the wire with ease. You all know by now from my articles that nothing on the Houston farm goes right the first time. What was supposed to be an easy run of wire ended up being an obstacle course. Between the roots and stumps, you never knew when or where you might trip next.

For this same reason, the verses listed above are difficult for me to comprehend. I don't like obstacles, challenges, or trials. I want my job to be easy, efficient, and simple. However, James tells us to count it all joy when we meet various trials. Clearly, these Christians were going through significantly far worse trials and challenges than tripping over stumps while stretching wire, but you see the parallel. Christians today want to complain and moan about government policies and the way the world is turning, just to name a few things. Rather than complain about it, we should weep at the sin in the world but rejoice at the opportunities that we receive to show Jesus to this lost world.

The only way to overcome our obstacles is to watch our feet. In a dark world, we watch our feet by using the lamp provided by God (Psalm 119:105). While the world wonders in darkness, we are to be walking in the light. Let us never forget that even though obstacles are less than ideal to us, sometimes they are necessary.
