WHAT'S THE PRICE?

Revelation 2:13

I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is, and you hold fast My name, and did not deny My faith even in the days of Antipas, My witness, My faithful one, who was killed among you where Satan dwells.

What does it cost to follow Jesus? If we accepted what He said about that, would we still follow Him? Are we willing to sacrifice our lives for Him? What price do we have to pay?

Pergamum was a difficult place for Christians. It was the place where Satan had his throne. For this reason, it called by some, "Hell's Headquarters." The temple of Zeus was there. It was the center of emperor worship in the Roman world.

It was the place where Antipas met his fate. We know very little about him but what we do know is powerful. Jesus called him "my witness, my faithful one." The Greek word for "witness" is also the word for "martyr"; one who dies for their faith. The word doesn't really mean "martyr." "Witness" is the literal translation.

People who testified that Jesus is Lord were said to be "witnesses." Giving that testimony could cost you your life in a place like Pergamum; just ask Antipas. What's the price? Just ask Antipas who lived out the charge given to another church. "Be faithful to death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10).

How much must I give in order to follow Jesus? Everything. As people who live in a pagan culture today, we must be willing to follow in the steps of Antipas if necessary. That's a high price. Am I willing to pay it?

What's in Your Wallet?

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it."

Perhaps we've all thought about what we would do if we had a billion dollars (or at least some great amount of money). There were other pearls available for him to buy. These would not have cost nearly as much because their essence was not desirable. We can strive for other things like self, glory, fame, or fortune, but these are just cheap imitations and counterfeit comfort.

This pearl cost the merchant everything. It cost him his home, his job, his possessions, and perhaps even his reputation. Who in their right mind would sell everything they owned for one pearl? He would. He knew the value of something so precious. He was not going to pass up this opportunity to have something so great.

Have we found our pearl of great price? Have we given up everything for the cause of Jesus? Are we still buying cheap imitations, or have we found the real thing? Being a Christian cost a great price, but the reward is so much better than anything money could buy.
