JOY OR WORRY

Philippians 4:4, 6

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice
Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with
thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

"You just do not understand what I'm going through." That is how I would like to react when people tell me "do not worry." Most of us could make a list of our troubles; for some, it would be longer than for others. I have my own and so do you. Thankfully, mine is nothing like Job's.

On the other hand, I have many reasons for rejoicing. Is it not interesting that Philippians 4:4 was written by a man in prison? It was written by a man who had experienced a lot of hardships. It was written by a man who would eventually be executed for his faith in God and his love for Christ.

Like us, he could react to life's difficulties in a couple of ways. He could give in to anxiety or he could rejoice. He chose joy. That says something very profound; it says that how we react to the storms of life is a choice that we make.

It is easier to rejoice when we focus on Jesus. In this same chapter, he wrote "I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need" (Philippians 4:12). It is in that context that he wrote the memorable words "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). If I want to rejoice in all situations, I need to learn to focus on my Lord.

Lessons from Barbed Wire Pt. 5: Completion of a Task

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing." 2

Timothy 4:7-8

I would be lying if I told you I enjoyed putting up the barbed wire fence. The cuts, falls, and sweat are inconveniences that I would rather not have. People have asked me if I believe after all this work that the fence will hold the cattle in their respective lots. What kind of a question is that?? Yes, I think it will! If I didn't, my father, brother, and I would still be stretching wire and fixing holes in the fence. It seems like a weird question, but think about it in this way...

You are about to die and your children, spouse, or doctor asks you sincerely, "Do you think you will go to Heaven?" What will you say? You have put in the work. You have overcome the obstacles of life and been patient with the promises of God. You have worn the proper protective gear in the process of living a Christian life and yet you still say, "I don't know..."

Notice what Paul says at the end of his life. He knew he had put in the work for the Lord. His task was completed. As he metaphorically turned to look at the work he had done, he tells us what he has accomplished: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." Because of this, Paul knew his task was completed and he would receive his reward (2 Timothy 4:8). We too can truly have confidence in our work and the completion of the task. Living and working for the Lord per his rules and terms will reward us with a home with Him. Let's work to hear Him say, "Well done."
