Who Do You See?

"Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up!" Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Close your eyes and count to ten. Open. Look around at your surroundings. Who is there? Who isn't there? Why are they there? Why are you there? These may seem like odd questions to ask sitting in a church pew or riding home in your car; however, I promise there is a point.

Imagine you are in ancient Babylon. You have been taken captive by the Babylonian military and now you are just trying to stay alive. You wake up one morning and hear there is a new law in the nation. The law states when a certain song plays, you must worship an image of the king or you will die. Not only will you die but you will die by being burned alive in a furnace used for making bricks for the Babylonian empire. Being a Babylonian slave, you would have seen this furnace. Which would you choose?

For Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, there was no question. You perhaps know them better as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego. These men were taken captive by the Babylonians, made into eunuchs, and forced to learn the laws of the Babylonians (Daniel 1). Then, they were placed in charge of certain Babylonian provinces and likely would not have been with each other. Then, the music played...

People all over the empire of Babylon fell to the ground and worshiped the idol. But as the people bowed, three remained standing. I can imagine Shadrach thinking, "I'm the only one," and then looking across the province and seeing Meshach and Abed-nego still standing. I can only imagine the comfort they must have felt knowing someone else wasn't going to bow.

We live in a world where everyone bows to idols. These idols may not be images of gold or silver but they are people, possessions, fame, money, etc. We compromise our faith for fortune and forget what our true purpose is. We must remember to look up and make sure we have surrounded ourselves with people who will stand with us. Just like Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes 4, there is strength and power in numbers.
