God forbid that I should be better known for unwise words than for integrity. May I never prize the unwise lack of restraint shown by some today. The foolish of such a man ruins, not only his way, but the way of others also.

What if Jesus Came Today?

The only way to obey this gospel is to be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38) and thus you are added to the body of Christ (Colossians 1:18).
