The Tongue

If the answer is no to either, it is probably best left unsaid.

James talks much about the tongue. In James 3: 1-18 he compares the tongue to a small rudder steering a great ship (4) and tells us that although every creature can be tamed, no one can tame the tongue (7 & 8). He offers a strong condemnation to the Christian that fails to bring this unruly member into control. James 1: 26, "If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless". Worthless religion equals a lost soul. Is the freedom of saying whatever you want worth the cost of your soul?

The tongue can be a great instrument for good. We can properly use it to pray and praise God. We use it to teach those who are lost or those who have strayed from the way. We can use it to encourage those who are undergoing the problems that come to us all with our daily living and to comfort those grieving the loss of a loved one or facing the other challenges life sends their way.

The tongue is truly one of God's most versatile creations. How are you using yours? Use it to steer your soul to heaven and to bring others with you.
