<u>Discouragement</u>

Do you ever feel discouraged in your Christian endeavors? I think this is something that almost everyone feels at some time. Perhaps your financial situation has changed and you can no longer give as you would like. Maybe you are becoming more mature (OK older) and you can't be as active in the work of the Church as you would like. It could be family problems, illness (yours or a family member), or many other things or combinations of things that cause you to be discouraged. It is not a sin to be discouraged. Even Jesus got discouraged at times. Mark 9:19 says in part, "And He answered them and said, "O unbelieving generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I put up with you?" The question is how do you deal with your discouragement?

Paul was a prisoner when he wrote his letter to Philemon. As such, his movements and actions were restricted. Was Paul discouraged? Probably or he would likely not have made the point that he was a prisoner. He could have easily claimed that as a prisoner there was little of God's work that he could do; however, he didn't let discouragement stop him. He wrote letters, like the Philemon letter, while in prison to encourage, exhort and rebuke. He knew that Onesimus (which means useless) was a slave who had ran away from a Christian master. Onesimus appears to have responded to the gospel while in prison and was ministering to Paul for the gospel. Paul's letter encourages Philemon and basically tells him how changed Onesimus was and how useful he had become to Paul. Paul made it clear that he was sending him back to his master so Philemon could, if so inclined; send him back to Paul of his free will. He is helping Onesimus do the right thing and reminds Philemon that he needs to remember that they are all brothers in Christ gently reminding him to do the right thing. Paul mentions his fellow workers that are with him Timothy, Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke as well as a fellow prisoner, Epaphras. Paul not only was conducting a prison ministry but an outreach ministry from prison as well.

Paul's example in this is as valid today as it was then. He could have taken the poor me approach but instead from the Philemon letter and other readings shows that he took advantage of opportunities and resources doing everything he could to spread the gospel. Don't be discouraged dwelling on what you can't do but rather look for the things you can do. God knows our abilities and limitations better than we do ourselves. Remember discouragement is one of the well-worn tools in Satan's tool box. Don't let him use it on you.

"Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing. We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves." 1 Thess. 5:11-13.
