A REDEEMER Ruth 4:14

Then the women said to Naomi, "blessed is the Lord who has not left you without a redeemer today, and may his name become famous in Israel.

Customs in the biblical world seem very strange to us. One, in particular, is found in the role that Boaz played in the book of Ruth. Boaz was related Mahlon, the dead husband of Ruth. In fact, he was considered one of his "closest relatives" (2:20).

That relationship brought serious responsibilities. Not the least of those was the obligation to marry the widow of the deceased relative, in cases where no children had been born, and raise up an heir for the one who had died. He was known as the "redeemer."

Redeemers did their thing when there seemed to be no hope for the future of a family. They rescued them by doing something that the family could not do for itself. There was no hope apart from the redeemer.

That was God's role in relation to Israel in Egypt. After the Red Sea was crossed, Moses wrote a song of praise to the Lord. In that song, Israel was the people that God had "redeemed" (Exodus 15:16, KJV). All of that points to the Great Redeemer. Sin puts one in a much more hopeless condition than Ruth was in; it separates one from God eternally. We were in a hopeless position but God intervened as He did with Israel. 1 Peter 1:19 says that He redeemed us with the blood of His Son. Because of Him, we are not "without a redeemer." There is real hope for the hopeless.

And I Cried... "Jesus wept." John 11:35

There are many things men are told to never do. For example, a man should never hit a woman. Also, a man should never cheat on his wife, taxes, or golf score. It has also been said that a man should never cry.

However, emotion is simply one of the greatest gifts ever given to humankind by God. Without emotion, how could we become saddened by our sin or overwhelmed by the power of Jesus? In John 11, Jesus received terrible news. His great friend, Lazarus, had died. Jesus knew he was dying and most everyone expected Jesus to go heal him thus saving his life. However, Jesus did not. Instead, Jesus stood outside the tomb, looked at the stone covering the door, and cried. Why was Jesus so grieved when he knew he could bring Lazarus back from the dead? What did Jesus feel that caused him to weep?

Death had separated someone Jesus truly loved from his presence. Jesus had enjoyed the company of Lazarus so much so that the Bible says Jesus loved Lazarus and his family. Yet, now he is gone. Jesus is grieved by the separation he feels.

It is no mystery why a person lost in sin is considered dead by God (Ephesians 2:1). The sin in our lives separates us from God just as death separated Jesus from one of his best friends. The pain and sorrow expressed in verse 35, "Jesus wept," can be felt every time we go astray from the commands and will of God. As Jesus wept for Lazarus, the Jews were saying, "Oh how he loved him!" (v. 36). When we sin, Jesus does not weep merely out of disappointment but because he loves us.

Jesus called out to Lazarus and Lazarus came out of that tomb. Today, Jesus is calling us to come forth out of our spiritual death. Unlike Lazarus, we can refuse Jesus' call. By doing so, we are just continuing to lay in the grave. How many of us are willing to stay in the grave? Hopefully, none of us are.
