YOU CAN AT LEAST LOOK WISE

Proverbs 17:27, 28

He who restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding. Even a fool, when he keeps silent, is considered wise; When he closes his lips, he is considered prudent.

One of life's great ironies is that some Christians boast about their lack of self-control. That sounds strange, doesn't it? Think about that for a moment. Have you not heard Christians say "I just say whatever is on my mind?" Where is the virtue in that? How is that like Christ in any way?

The wise man said that "he who restrains his words has knowledge." Consider the opposite, if you lack the ability or the willingness to restrain your words, you do not have knowledge. Verse 28 is even more to the point; "even a fool, when he keeps silent, is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is considered wise."

If one is to believe what the Bible says, when I boast about not controlling what I say, I'm boasting about lacking wisdom. Is that something of which we should be proud or something of which we should repent?

Why is it that someone who says whatever comes to mind, regardless of how hurtful it may be, is admired? What is the attraction in an obvious lack of wisdom? What is admirable about a lack of restraint? "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit" (Proverbs 18:21).

A Tree Limb Christian

John 15:5-6

"I am the Vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, the same brings forth much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered. And they gather and cast them into the fire, and they are burned."

It's true. Jesus does say, "I am the vine and you are the branches." As a branch, our job is twofold: 1) be attached to the vine, Jesus, and 2) bear fruit. There's only one tiny problem. Sometimes we feel like a branch struck by lightning. The stresses of life and the intensity of the storm cause us to forget our roots in whom we are set, and thus we feel as if we are hanging by a thread (or splinter...however you decide to picture it). Jesus says it very plainly here when he says, "for without me you can do nothing." As part of this vine, do we really rely on our source when the winds and lightning seem to want to tear us away? It is a beautiful picture to know that Jesus **wants** to hold onto us as much as we **need** to hold onto him. This is true both in the storms and in the sunshine.

There is one way we can become separated from the true vine as described in these verses. That consequence comes if we are not bearing fruit. In today's society, the roll of the "spiritual fruit bearer" often falls on the elders, deacons, and ministers. However, that is not the example we see from the early church or from Jesus. Each person did *what they could* and *what they were authorized to do* in order to spread the gospel of Jesus and enhance his kingdom. In the early chapters of the book of Acts, the inspired writer (likely Luke) describes the church as having all things common (Acts 2:44). In other words, it wasn't just the apostles who were fulfilling spiritual tasks. It took everyone.

Maybe today as you read this article you feel as if lightning and wind has snapped you from the vine. I encourage you to remember your roots and grow back stronger and as part of the true vine from whom you split. Perhaps you aren't bearing fruit or using your abilities to your greatest potential. If that is the case, GET TO WORK! Jesus needs you active in the church. Regardless of how you work, remember, Jesus wants you!
