She has done what she could; she has anointed My body beforehand for the burial.

That almost sounds like this devout lady was in such a sad state that she could hardly do anything. If you are quoting that verse, you can use a certain voice inflection to make it sound like "awe, poor thing, there wasn't much she could do but at least she did what she could."

There is nothing in Mark's account to indicate that she was poor or that there was little else that she could do. As some noted, this perfume could have been sold for a lot of money.

What did she do with it? She did not sell it; she poured every drop on Jesus. Every time we learn from this verse, we fulfill the words of Jesus (v. 9). But what do we learn? I would answer that question with another question. Do we do what we can do for Jesus?

Regardless of who we are, there are things that we can do for Jesus. Our faithfulness to Him extends well beyond just "coming to church." Faithfulness defines the way we live every day. Did I make the opportunity to encourage someone today? Did I feed some hungry person? Did I minister to a shut-in person? Did I speak a kind restoring word to someone struggling with sin? Do I do what I can do for Jesus?

# Torpedoes That Sink Our Fellowship Part 1: Negativity "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" Philippians 4:4

The church was designed by Jesus Christ to be composed of many members. Fellowship is the bond that holds Christians together within the body of Christ. However, this bond can be broken and has been broken in many ways by many sources. Rather than being the unified body of Christ, the body has been broken and divided. In this next series of articles, I am going to explore why.

Reason 1: Negativity

Oh negativity... We've all encountered it. Some have encountered it more than others. Some have encountered it so few times that the idea seems foreign. Thoughts of negativity can be as heavy as cement while releasing that negativity can make you feel light as a feather. Negativity is a repellant tending to push people away. It causes us to become filled with doubt and pain. It clouds our perspective and makes us feel empty and alone, though we are surrounded by those who love us.

When I would show cattle, I would walk out of the show ring and everyone would comment on how good of a job I did—even if I was awarded last place. Then, one person would comment on everything I did wrong and how awful my show-stock looked. One little comment overshadowed all the other positive comments and ruined the remainder of the show and sometimes even my whole week. I couldn't get my mind off the negativity, which caused me to carry a negative demeanor. That is when I realized there is a difference between constructive criticism and putting down. We should be willing to help each other constructively. That's what Paul did in Galatians 2:11-14 when he corrected Peter.

If we are in Christ, we have every reason to rejoice. Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice always! We should not ignore that command.

Sure, things will go wrong and there will be negative moments. However, we should remember that fellowship implies that there is a bond among believers. When things get rough and we become negative, let's remember Paul's words in Galatians 6:2, "Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ."
