In asking God to help with the load we carry, remember to thank Him. We need that reminder that we are blessed. Is the load too heavy? Give it to God. He cares for you, He truly does.

The fence was well built, but fear caused a breach in security. As we think about guarding our hearts, let us continue to build fences around our souls. Fences which are able to keep Satan out and Jesus in. Let's not let fear but glory in our protection. May God be praised!
