BORN AGAIN

John 3:3

Jesus answered and said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Nicodemus didn't know what to make of Jesus' words and so he asked "How can a man be born when he is old?" (Jn. 3:4). So, Jesus explained the new birth in John 3:5. "unless one is born of water and the spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God."

John 3 reveals that baptism was a part of the ministry of Jesus. In verse 22, He and His disciples came to Judea "and there He was spending time with them and baptizing." As chapter 3 ends and chapter four begins, Jesus moved into Galilee. Why did he make that move? "The Lord knew that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John" (John 4:1).

With the attention given to baptism in the ministry of Jesus, it makes no sense to claim that the water of verse 5 is childbirth. That assertion is nothing more than an attempt to get around what the Scriptures teach about baptism.

A few decades later, Paul wrote, "He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:5).

There are some important and hopeful images; "washing of regeneration", and "born again." Because of the mercy of God, we can be washed and have new life.
