John 18:36

My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, then My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm.

"Are you the king of the Jews?" That was Pilate's question to Jesus. He had heard the accusation against Jesus; He claimed to be a king (John 19:12). In his own mind he had every reason to be concerned. He was Caesar's representative, anyone who claimed to be a king was considered an insurrectionist.

Jesus put his concerns to rest by speaking about the nature of His kingdom. "My kingdom is not of this world." His kingdom is spiritual in nature. He does not rule over any geographical territory. He reigns in the hearts and lives of those who follow Him by faith.

When Jesus spoke to Pilate, He revealed an important but often overlooked truth. His kingdom is not advanced by carnal means. If His kingdom were of this world, His followers would have fought to prevent Him from being executed.

I pray that we do not lose sight of that truth. The primary concern of Christians ought to be kingdom business. As interested as some may be in politics, it is not kingdom business. The kingdom of heaven, by its very nature, cannot be advanced through a political agenda. In all of my years of preaching I have never endorsed any political candidate. I have no intention of changing that. The King of kings said "My kingdom is not of this world."

Things I Wish...Parents Knew

"Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it."

Proverbs 22:6

Parenting. I know some of you must be thinking, "You don't have kids! How can you tell us what to do??" Well, first, I'm not trying to tell anyone what to do. We must look at the Bible and see what God wants us to do. Second, I am also not a young lady but I wrote an article addressing them three weeks ago. That being said, here are some things I (and the Lord) wish parents knew.

- 1) You have to let go. As a son, I can understand the desire to be let go from the grasp of my parents. I cannot, however, understand how hard it must be to lose the dependency once held in infancy to something like a driver's license or a spouse or even a youth outing. Parenting is a series of letting go. As we train our children to respect God and do his will, we must trust them to take responsibility for themselves. We do a great disservice to our children when we refuse to let them live their own lives. There is a time to be an example and teach, but there is also a time to let them take what they have learned and put it into practice.
- 2) Your child is special. We have to be careful here because we only desire to build our children up, not the pedestal they stand on. So often, we try to exalt our children as "better than sliced bread" because we have pride in them. It is okay to be proud of your child, but we cannot teach the child to exceed humility. That being said, yes, your child is special. He or she is special to you, me, the church, and the Lord. David says in Psalm 139:14 that he was "fearfully and wonderfully made." We cannot let our children forget this, especially in a society that gains pleasure from degrading other people.
- 3) You are responsible for teaching your child. I love all of our kids! I would throw myself in front of a train if it meant saving one of them. However, learning about God begins in the home. When your child messes up, and they will, you cannot blame the ministers, youth program, society, TV, or friends of the child. Ultimately, the child made the wrong choice and it is up to you to teach your child why it was wrong and what he or she should do to be right.

Parenting is a series of two very difficult things: letting go and wise instruction. No parent is perfect except God our Father. He lets us go by allowing us free will every single day. He created us special by making us in a way that is unique to everyone else. He took the responsibility to teach us his will through his word. We must use God as our example and train our children in the way they should go.
