2 Corinthians 8:3, 4

For I testify that according to their ability, and beyond their ability, they gave of their own accord, begins us with much urging for the favor of participating in the support of the saints.

I can just hear the comments as the Macedonian Christians left the Sunday assembly. "That Paul, he's always begging for more money." "Yes, he never shows up around here unless he wants something."

In reality the Christians in Macedonia were not like that. But before we examine their attitude, think about their situation. 2 Corinthians 8:2 refers to their "deep poverty." How poor were they? One can't put any number to how little they had. The Bible simply notes of "deep poverty."

Their attitude is also important; "abundance of joy" describes their hearts. Though the word "generosity" is not used in the first five verses of this chapter, it certainly applies. They gave "beyond their ability."

The key to their generosity is found in verse 5; "they first gave themselves and to the Lord and to us by the will of God." God had given His all to them, they owed their all to Him. How much is too much to give to God? Can you imagine God saying "I've given them all I can give?"

No, you wouldn't hear the poor Macedonians saying "Paul is always begging for money." Quite the opposite. Paul wrote that they were "begging us with much urging for the favor of participating in the support of the saints." When is the last time I have done that?

Things I Wish...Baby Boomers and Generation X Knew "I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment." 1 Corinthians 1:10

Sometimes, you have to risk people liking you to express Biblical truth. For the past three weeks, I have received emails, calls, texts, etc. expressing how much "we needed those articles," especially those addressing our young people. Well, it is my opinion that we need this one also. I say these things in love and respect for those older than me; however, here are some things I (and the Lord) wish the older generations knew.

1) It's not all the millennial's fault. We are dividing the body of Christ every single day by being so petty with blame. Kids aren't staying in the church, so we blame the millennials. Kids have no respect for God, so we blame millennials. Kids are consumed with technology and social media while losing the ability to talk face to face, so we blame millennials. By playing this blame game, we create a division in the church, thus dividing the Lord's body! Jesus prayed for unity (John 17:20-21) and said that "a kingdom divided cannot stand."

2) Don't be afraid to try something new. One of the most dangerous things a congregation can say is, "We've never done that before." When Jesus walked the Earth, he introduced ideas and commandments that had never been considered by the people of his day (read the Sermon on the Mount). I'm not saying we should blindly follow every new idea that comes along, but we should not be afraid to try new things, so long as they are scriptural and beneficial.

3) Spend time with those who are younger. The more I look at our congregations in America, the more I see generational gaps. Each generation thinks they are the best and refuses to listen to or spend time learning from each other. Titus 2 tells us that older women are to teach younger women how to "love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands." All it takes is an interest in someone to build a relationship. Our young people can learn a lot from those older, and believe it or not, those who are older can also learn from the younger.

All these points could be summed up in one word: unity. We have lost our unity in the Lord's church by creating generational gaps. It breaks my heart to see the hatred one generation has for the other. Remember, we are all people and if we are in Christ, we are brothers and sisters. Let's not forget that.
