# "Therefore, a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh." Genesis 2:24

His friends noticed his choice and asked why he wanted catfish instead of a salad or steak like them. The young man replied, "I just love fish."

A Jewish rabbi explained this parable in an internet video I saw the other day. The rabbi explained, "If he truly loved the fish, he would not have taken from it for his own gain, but would have given to it and cared for it." I know this is a somewhat extreme example, but I think our society has drastically abused the idea of love. We can love mama and God and apple pie all at the same time. We tend to use love as an adjective rather than a verb.

Love is both what God is and what God does. 1 John 4:16 tells us that God is love. John 3:16 says that God loved the world so much that he gave his son to provide a way for us to have eternal life. But what does all this have to do with marriage?

Marriage is about giving. In Ephesians 5, Paul discusses how a husband and a wife are to operate and serve within the confines of the marriage. Husbands are to love their wives. Is this only an emotion that is presented in ways of admiration? No. It is providing and nurturing the wife. It is a giving of self.

Next, wives are to submit to their husbands. Does this mean blindly following no matter what? Not at all. While the husband is the head of the household, I firmly believe the wife is the neck. She supports her husband and takes his command and administers it accordingly.

Love is so much more than we may perceive. Aren't we glad that God loves us and gave of himself by sending his son to die for us? If we love God, what are we giving him? If we love our spouse, what are we giving to him or her?
