We're supposed to side with the fisherman and realize how silly the capitalist is. The fisherman comes out looking wise, while the hard-working capitalist looks like a fool.

But I think they're both wrong.

Sure, the capitalist doesn't seem to have a sense of why he's working so hard – if he's successful, the best case scenario is that he'll wind up where the fisherman is. But why is the fisherman lying lazily beside his boat? Is that really the way to enjoy life?

You can't enjoy life unless you know what life is for. Life isn't about getting to a point where you have nothing to do. The meaning of life is so much more than that.

Life is about seeking the Creator and using our talents and opportunities to glorify him. Paul touched on this when he spoke to a group of philosophers in Athens:

[God] made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, that they should seek God, in the hope that they might feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, for "'In him we live and move and have our being'..." (Acts 17:26-28)

We were created to seek the Lord. There's no denying it. That's why a lazy fisherman can be just as miserable as a busy capitalist. If the end game for both of them is just to "enjoy life," they're both on the wrong track. They have no sense of purpose.

But it is also true that both the fisherman and the capitalist can be full of joy, because both can do what they do to the glory of God. Paul said, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Col. 3:23).

We must find ways to make our vocations and our leisure for God. Then life truly will be fulfilling.
