I am still waiting for them to come up with a good explanation on where that initial mass of energy came from. Remember this evolutionary view is a theory because it has not been proved; otherwise, it would be fact. Futile speculation indeed.

I feel sorry for all of these poor unbelieving people. Oh they may have all kinds of public recognition and/or feel good that they are living the life they have chosen. I wonder how much comfort they get from their "enlightened" ideas when they encounter the hard knocks of life. To have no hope in a loving God who cares for His children and is in control. I can't imagine trying to live life without having the avenue of prayer to God or knowing that He has a place prepared for me when my earthly sojourn is over.

I entitled this article "No Change" because I am convinced that despite all of our modern toys and advancements in science and other fields, many in our world today fit into Paul's description. It has been said, the more people change, the more they stay the same. I think this is very true and explains the many different conflicts in our world today. The only hope for our world is to embrace the God so many reject. He has not gone away from us; but rather, we have gone away from Him. Truly God is the answer to so many pressing questions.

How Should We Give?

"Jesus looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the offering box, and he saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. And he said, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them. For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."

Luke 21:1-4

I suppose the season of giving is upon us. The problem is this season is becoming more and more about receiving than giving. There are so many ways that Jesus views things differently than we do. This is perhaps best summed up by 1 Samuel 16:7 where God clearly states that he does not see as man sees but God looks at the heart. This is also true with our giving.

I love what Luke records in his gospel at the end of chapter 20 and the beginning of chapter 21. Jesus is rebuking the Scribes and honoring a poor widow. I would love to have seen the faces of the bystanders at this event. The Scribes were "spiritual superheroes" in the Jewish community. However, Jesus says they love to wear long robes and be given the best seats in the house (Luke 20:45-47) so they can be seen and glorified. I can imagine Jesus thinking back to his own Sermon on the Mount where he warned against practicing righteousness to be seen by men (Matt 6:1). Yet, here is this widow. A poor woman whose money amounted to very little in comparison. Further, the money she gave was all she had. We can learn a great deal from both groups.

First, we should remember that we all have something to give. We may not have an abundance of money, but we can always give of ourselves and our time. A hospital visit does a world of good even though we cannot pay their hospital bills. Second, we should remember that, at times, giving can hurt. I do not know if this woman was homeless, but I do know this money was all she had. From her giving, she gave up the ability to buy food or housing, but she still gave. Third, Jesus views value in a different way than we do. People were giving vast amounts of money out of their abundance. The amount was not the issue. The condition of the heart was.

So, how should we give? We should give like this woman. We should give full of selflessness and a desire to please God.
