## 1 Chronicles 17:16

## "Then David the king went in and sat before the Lord and said, "Who am I, O Lord God, and what is my house that You have brought me this far?"

There are, what I call, "the forgotten books of the Bible." Those are the books that we seldom read because they may not capture our attention as easily as other books. When you read the first nine chapters of 1 Chronicles you might get the impression that God intended them to be a cure for insomnia, unless you remember that God inspired this book for a purpose.

In ancient Israel, it was important for people to, not only know their national history, but also who they were individually. Each Israelite was not only a part of a nation; they were a part of a tribe. They also had an identity as members of clans. That's why genealogies are a big part of some books.

1 Chronicles 17:16 comes at a time in his life when David might have been disappointed. He has just been told that he will not be allowed to do one thing that he had dreamed about. God sent Nathan to tell the king "You shall not build a house for me to live in" (1 Chronicles 17:4).

If David were like me, his response would have been immature. Unlike me, he responded as a spiritual giant. Rather than get upset with God, he asked in wonder, "Who am I, O Lord God, what is my house that You have brought me thus far?" Rather than feel a sense of entitlement, David realized that he was undeserving of God's grace. God help us to develop the same attitude. Rather than moan, I ought to ask "who am I that God has blessed me so much?"

# The King, The Donkey, and the Fruit Tree

#### Mark 11:1-14

I know the title of this article sounds like an introduction to a terrible joke, but go with me on this. Mark 11 begins the famous narrative of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Jesus tells two of his disciples to go find a colt (as Mark puts it; others say donkey) that has not been broke to ride and bring it back for Jesus. Jesus rides the animal with no problems. (Having dealt with young, untamed horses and donkeys before, I can say this was a miracle.) Of course, you know how the story goes from here. What you may not be as familiar with is when Jesus, on his way to Bethany, cursed the fig tree for not bearing fruit. Yes, that's in the Bible, too.

For a fuller description of these events, you can read Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19, and John 12. However, I want us to look at ourselves and see who or what in this story we are most like.

First, the King. Of course, we want to be like Jesus. If we are in Christ, we become a member of his body. Therefore, people should see Jesus when they see us. Jesus knew he was king. He accepted the praise of the people. I am not saying we should accept praise, rather I am saying the opposite. We, as the body of Christ, should be giving praise and glory to the king.

Second, the donkey. Have you ever met a stubborn Christian? Don't answer that... This donkey was one who had not been broke to ride and, oh yeah, did I mention it was a DONKEY! I often find myself being like this animal: stubborn and wild, not wanting to submit to the authority of the one directing me. Fortunately, Jesus has a way of breaking us from what the world would have us to be.

Lastly, the fig tree. After Jesus leaves Jerusalem and goes to Bethany, he becomes hungry and tries to eat from a fig tree. However, the tree had no fruit. We often use John 15 as an assurance verse where Jesus says, "Abide in me and I will abide in you," concerning the vine and its branches. However, Jesus also said if a branch does not bear fruit, it will be cut off and cast into the fire. Are we bearing fruit for Christ or are we dead like the fig tree?

Think about it. Which of these are we most like? Are we giving our king the praise he deserves or are we being stubborn and unfruitful?
