He went on to call this the great and foremost commandment and then went on to add a second commandment in verse 39, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.' Jesus then declared that upon these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets (verse 40). In these few words, Jesus set the foundation for all the other biblical teachings. If we love God with our whole being, we are going to do all the things He commands us to do. If we love our neighbor as we love ourselves, we are going to abolish prejudice, warfare, and violence against the innocent. We would have peace on earth. Sadly such peace will have to wait for heaven and as in our world, evil championed by eager followers ignorant of their eternal destination (hell), is rampant.

Setting aside for a moment the fact that Christmas is worldly and not spiritual, if we could ask God what He wants for Christmas, what would He say? I think John has the answer for us in 1 John 5:3, "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and that His commandments are not burdensome." God would want for Christmas what He always has wanted from His children, our willing obedience that comes from our firmly rooted love for Him. Remember, love is the answer not just for the holiday season; but, for all time.
